#### **V. HEALTH HAZARD INFORMATION**

##### **Effects of Exposure:**

To the best of our knowledge the chemical, physical and toxicological properties of boron nitride have not been thoroughly investigated and recorded.

Nickel Oxide : Industrially, this element does not constitute an important health hazard. Exposure is related chiefly to the dust arising from the crushing and milling of the two chief ores. Large overdoses cause central nervous system disturbances, diarrhea, respiratory failure and death in experimental animals. (Sax, Dangerous Properties of Industrial Materials eighth edition)

##### **Acute Effects:**

**Inhalation:** Acute: Powder may cause irritation to the lungs and respiratory tract.  
Chronic: No chronic health effects recorded.

**Ingestion:** Acute: No acute health effects recorded. Relatively non-toxic, poorly absorbed from the alimentary tract.
